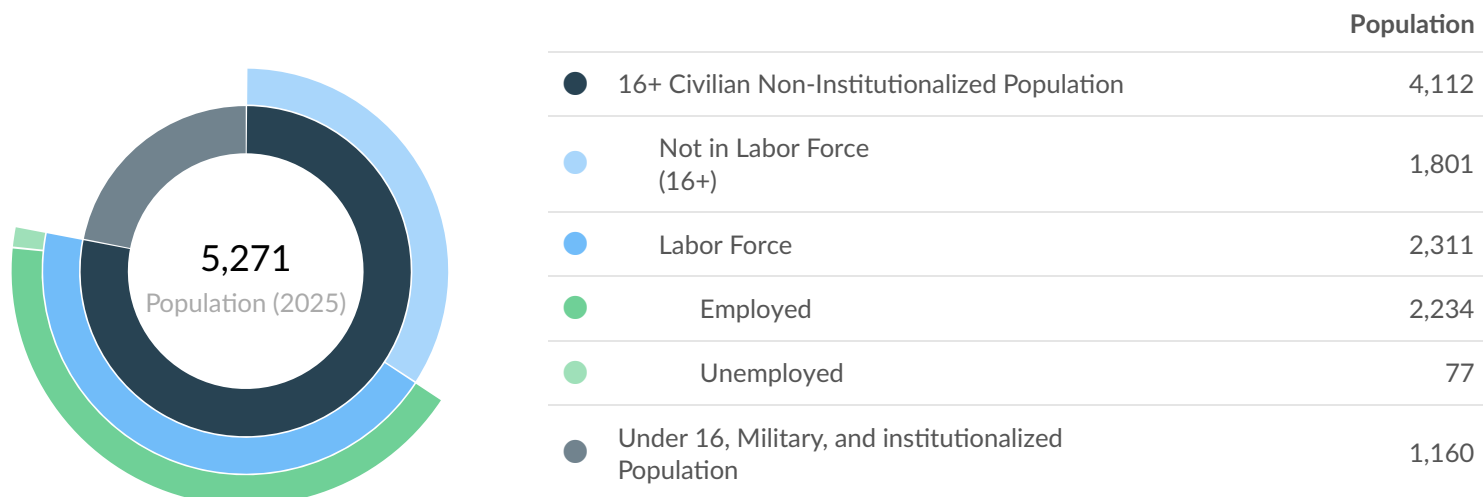
Median household income is **\$30.4K below** the national median household income of \$78.5K.

Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population **declined by 4.5%** since 2019, falling by 246. Population is expected to **increase by 0.3%** between 2024 and 2029, adding 14.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs **declined by 5.9%** in Coal County, OK from 1,638 to **1,541**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 4.1% by 10.0%**. As the number of jobs declined, the **labor force participation rate increased from 54.7% to 56.2% between 2019 and 2024**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **10.5% of Coal County, OK residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (11.0% below the national average), and **7.7% hold an Associate's Degree** (1.2% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Animal Production.

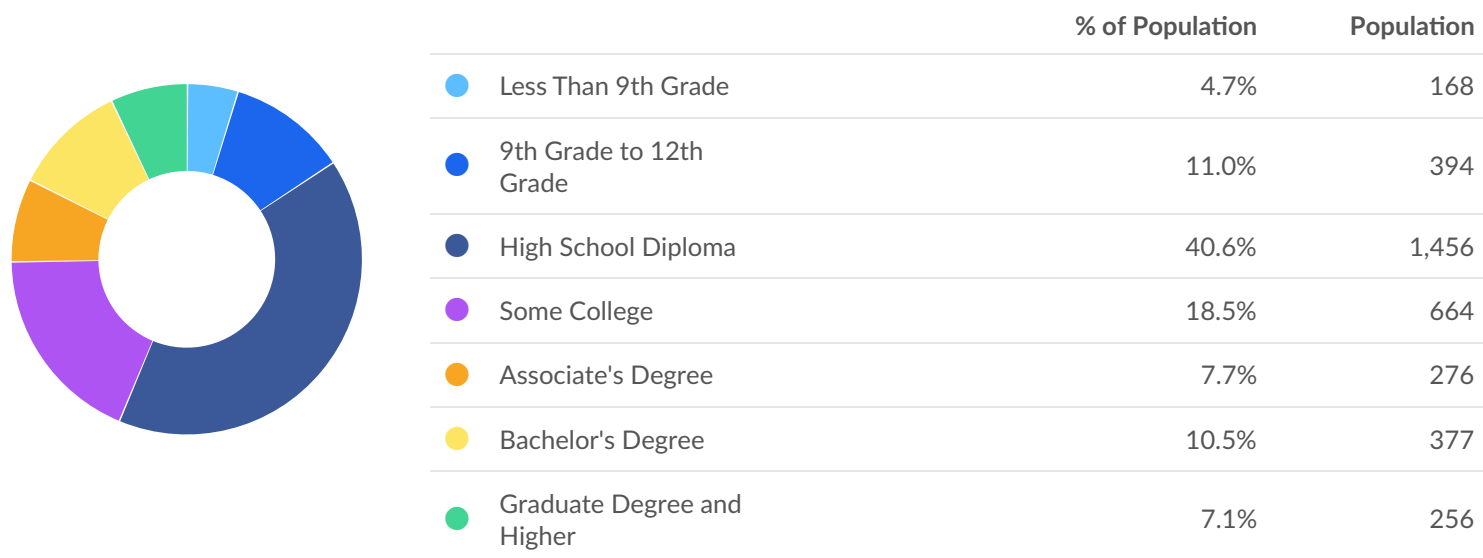

Apr 2025 Labor Force Breakdown



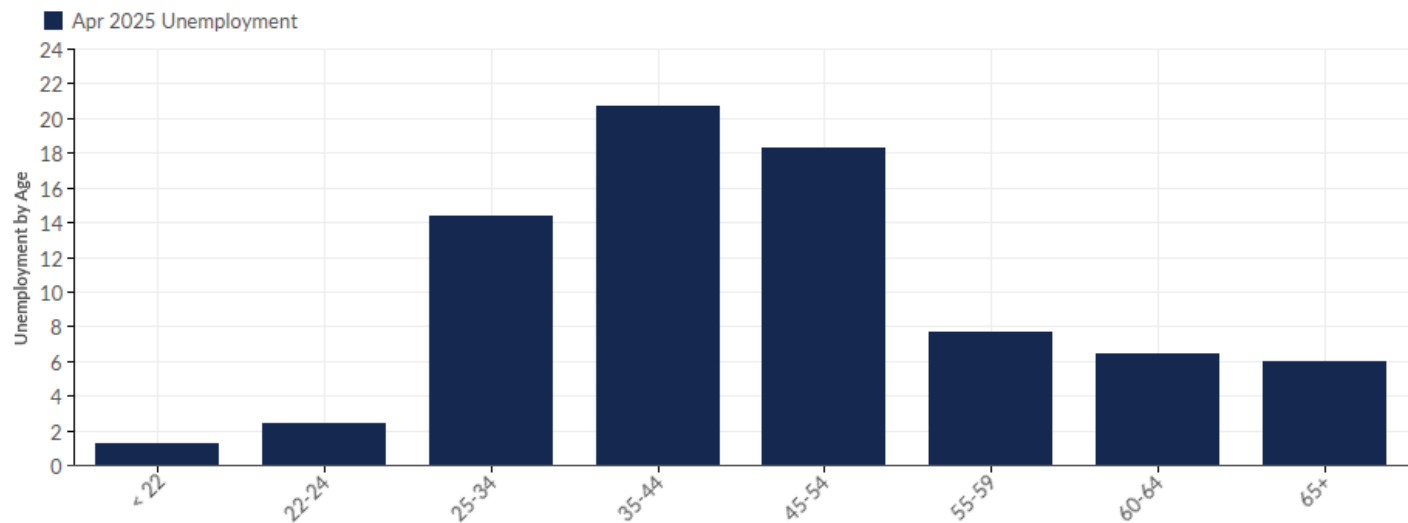
Educational Attainment

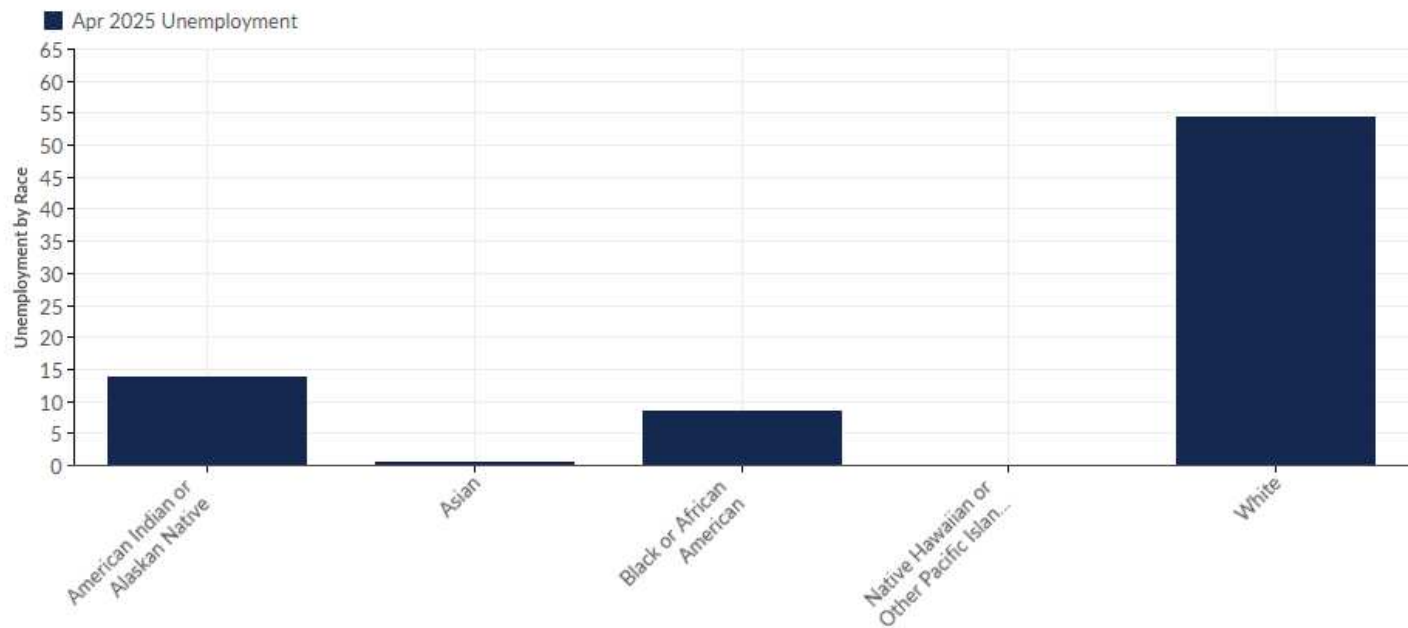

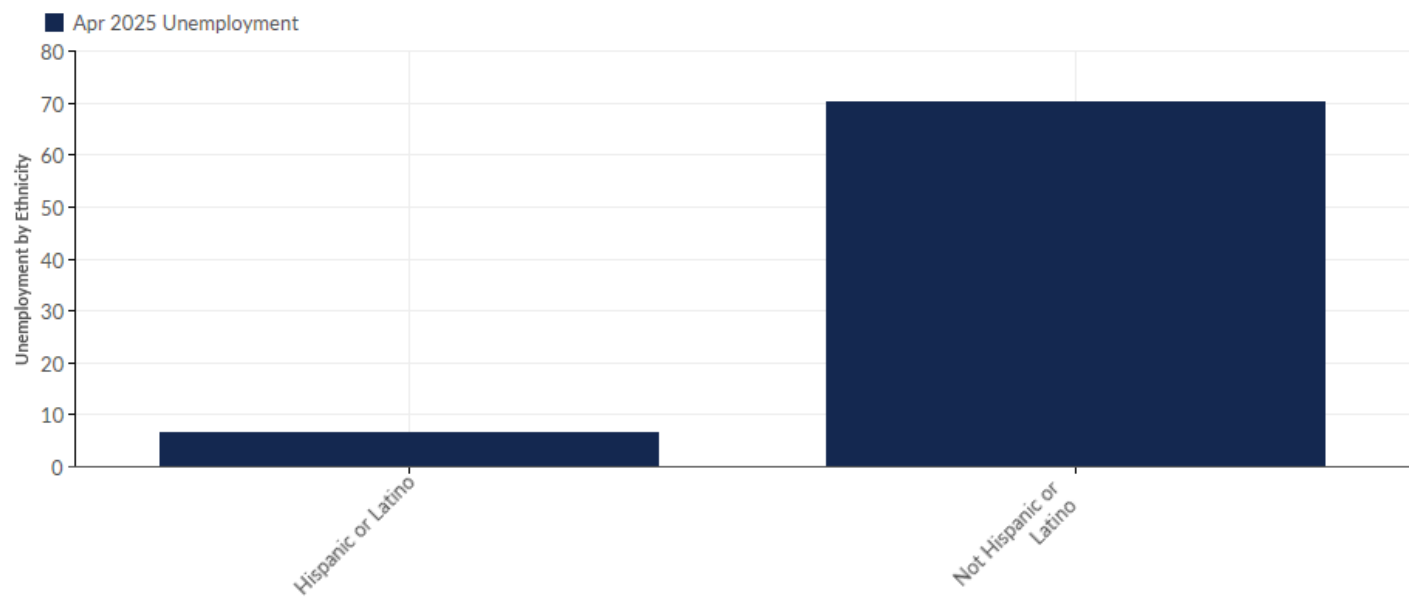

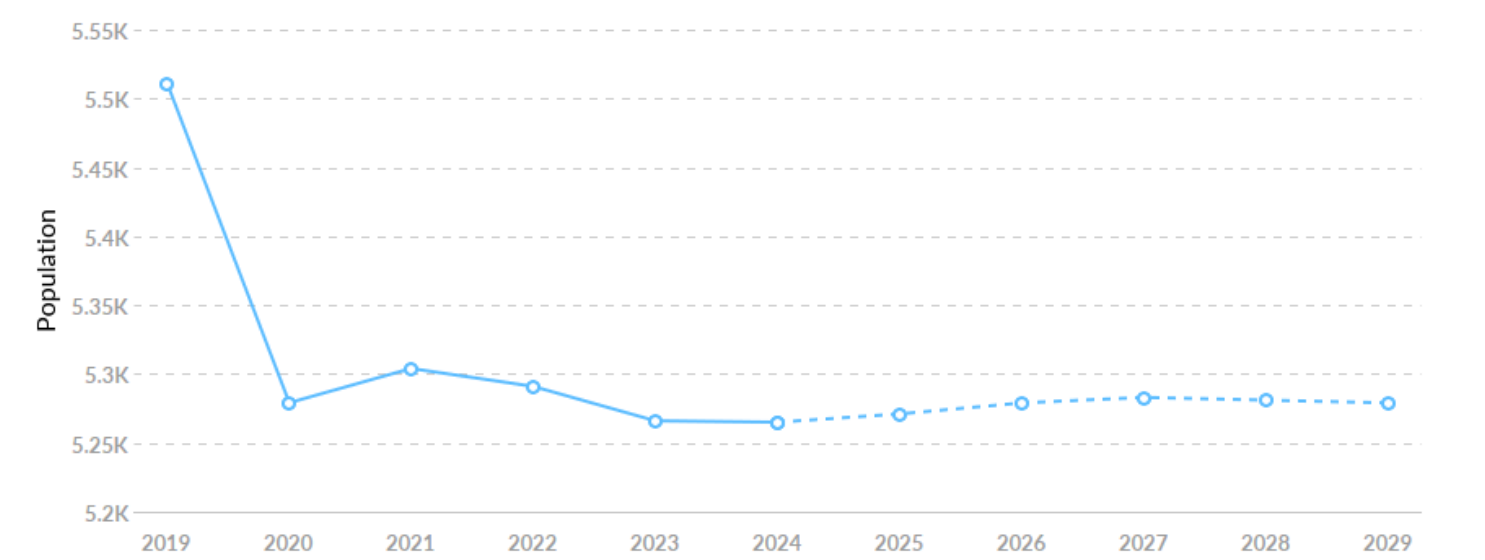

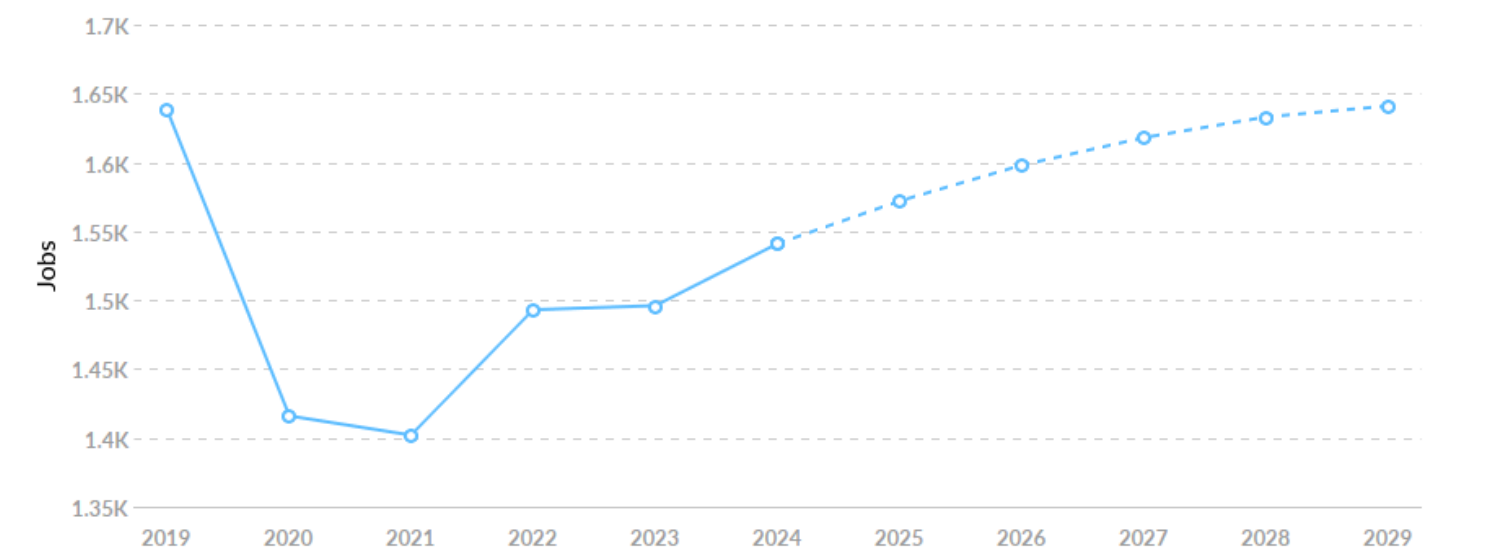

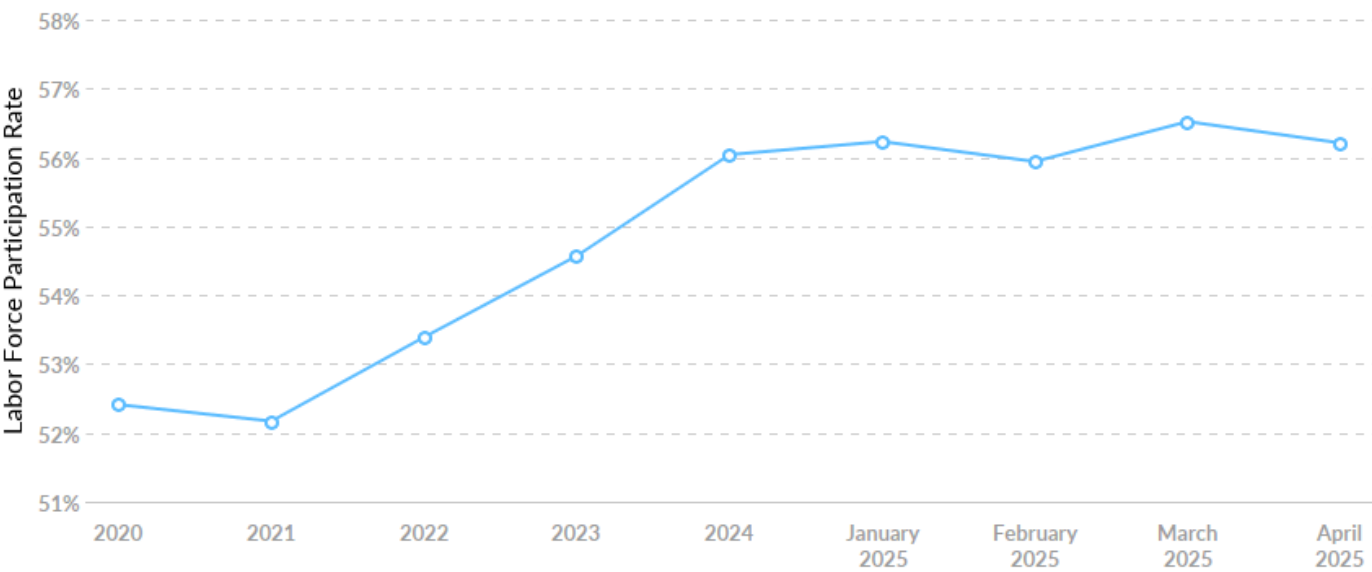
Job Trends

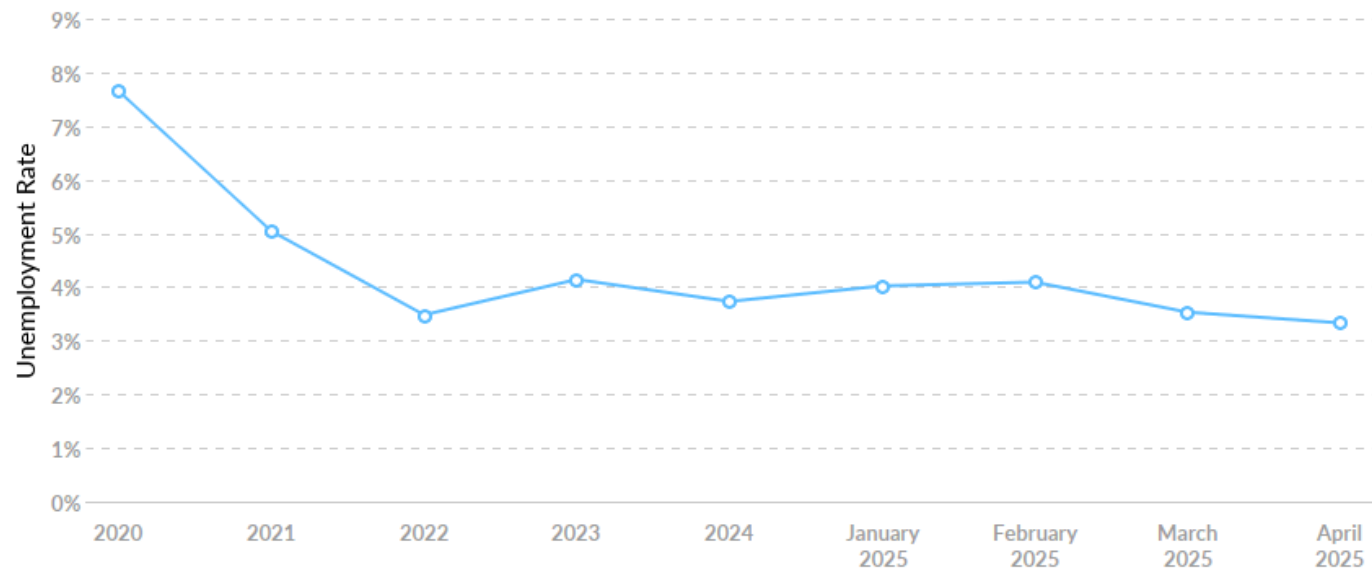

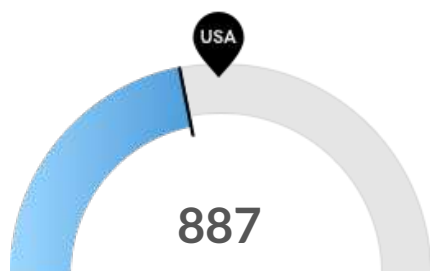
Unemployment Rate Trends

Coal County, OK had an April 2025 unemployment rate of 3.33%, **decreasing from 7.65%** 5 years before.



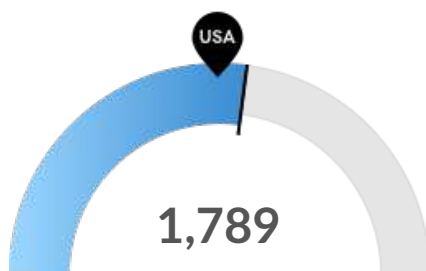

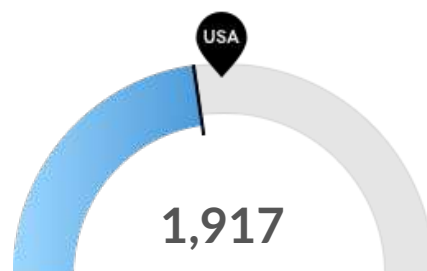
Millennials

Coal County, OK has 887 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 1,070.



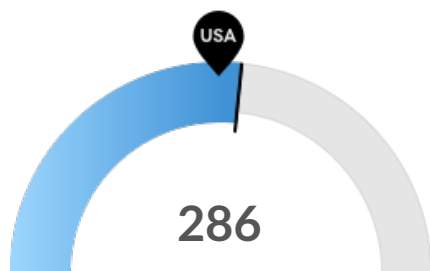
Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Coal County, OK. The national average for an area this size is 1,590 people 55 or older, while there are 1,789 here.



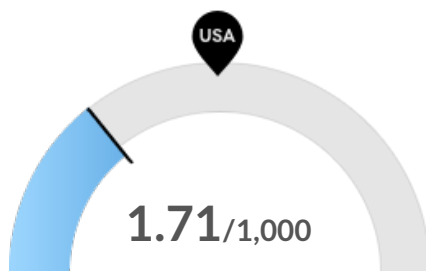
Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Coal County, OK. The national average for an area this size is 2,193 racially diverse people, while there are 1,917 here.



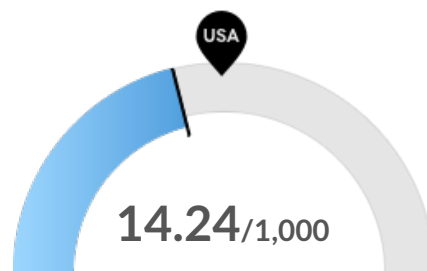
Veterans

Coal County, OK has 1.71 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.54 per 1,000 people.

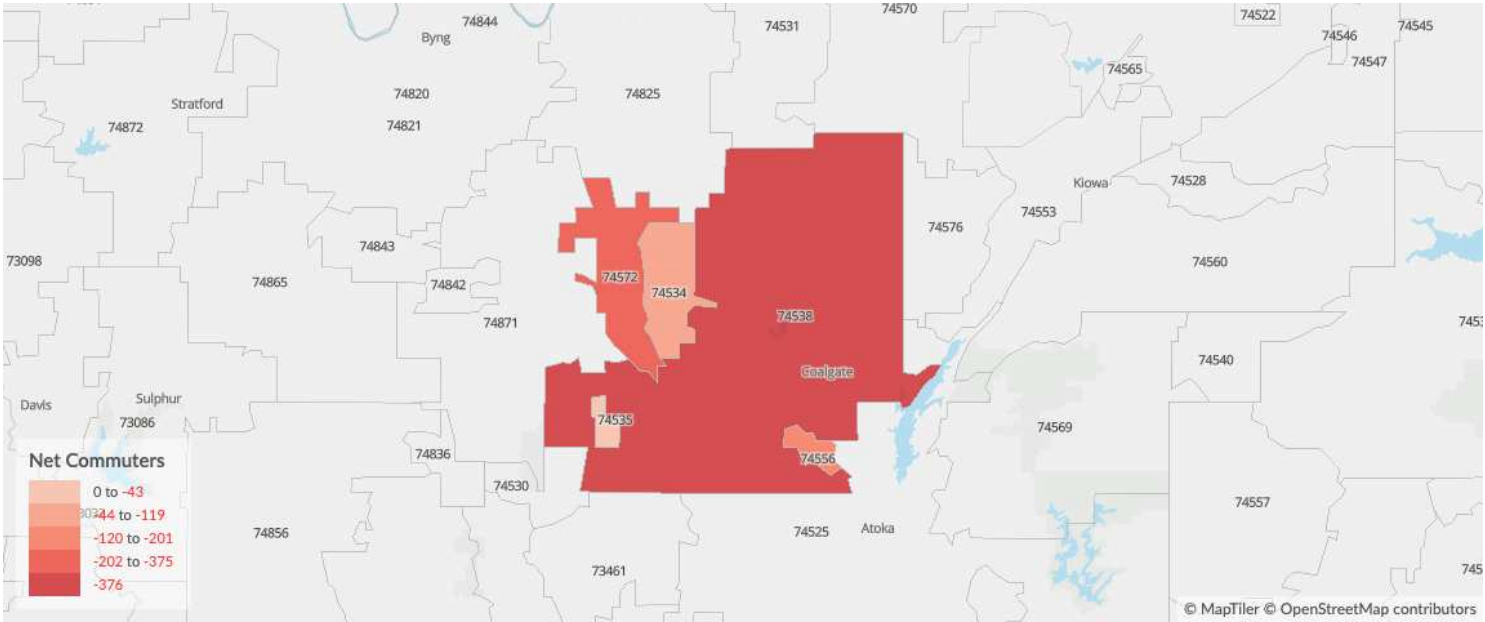


Property Crime

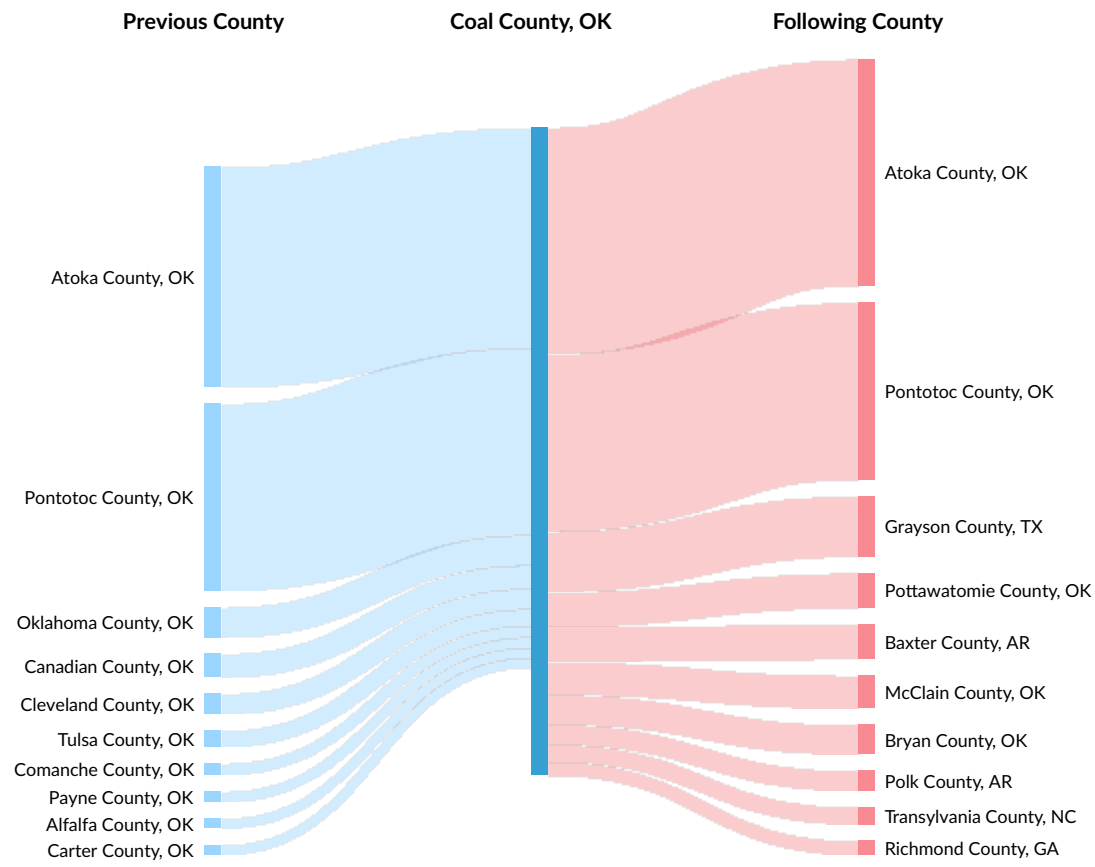

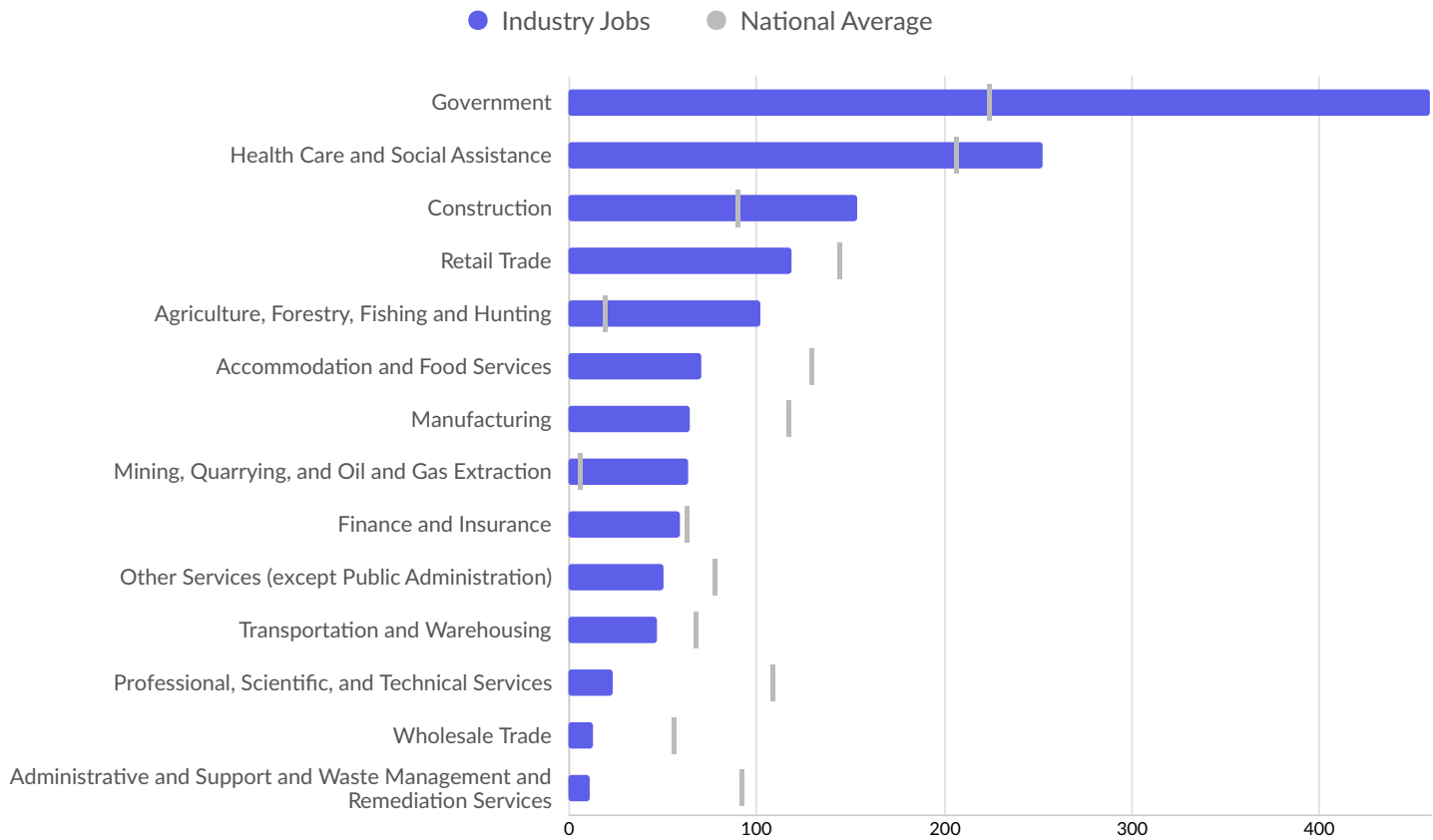

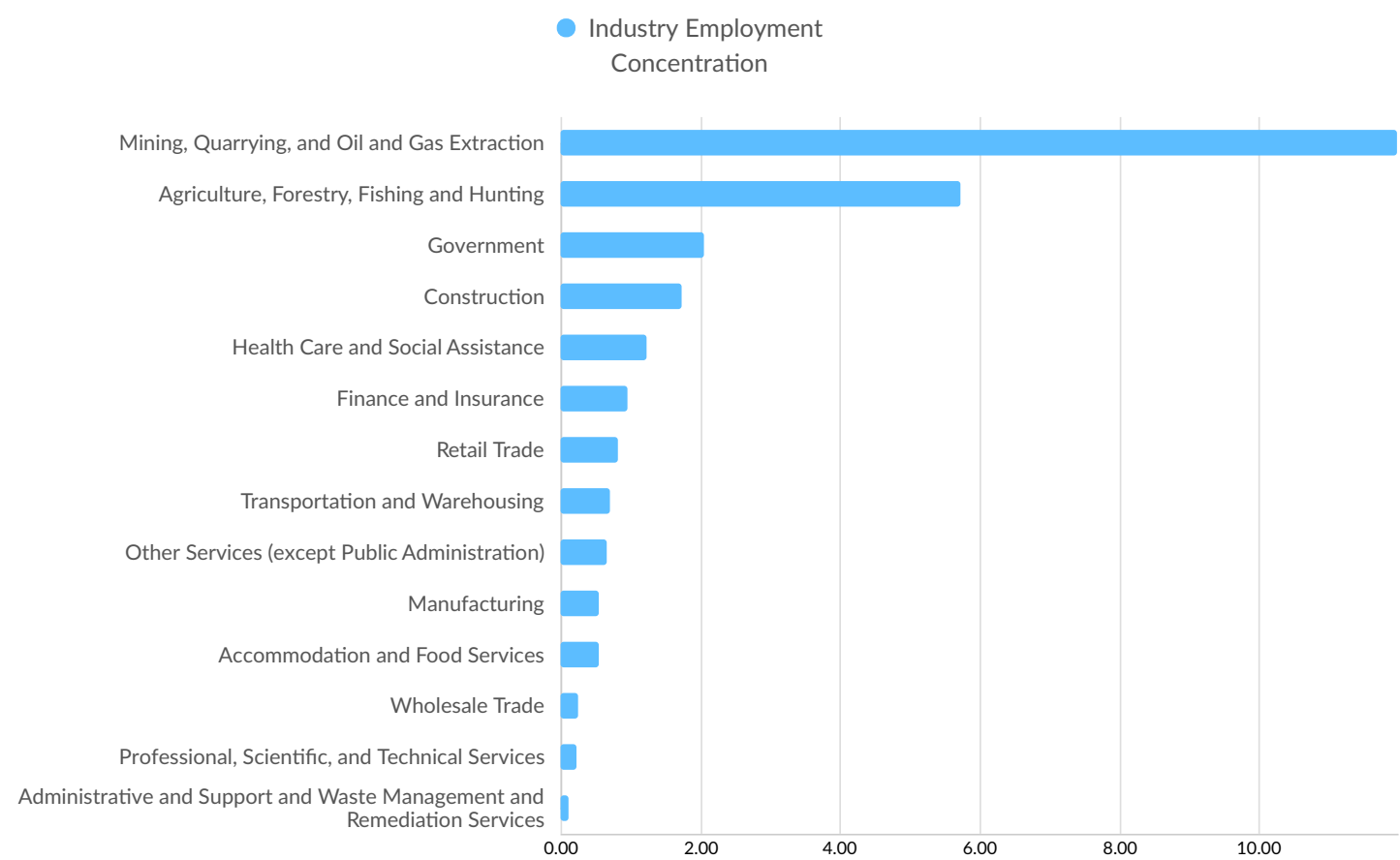

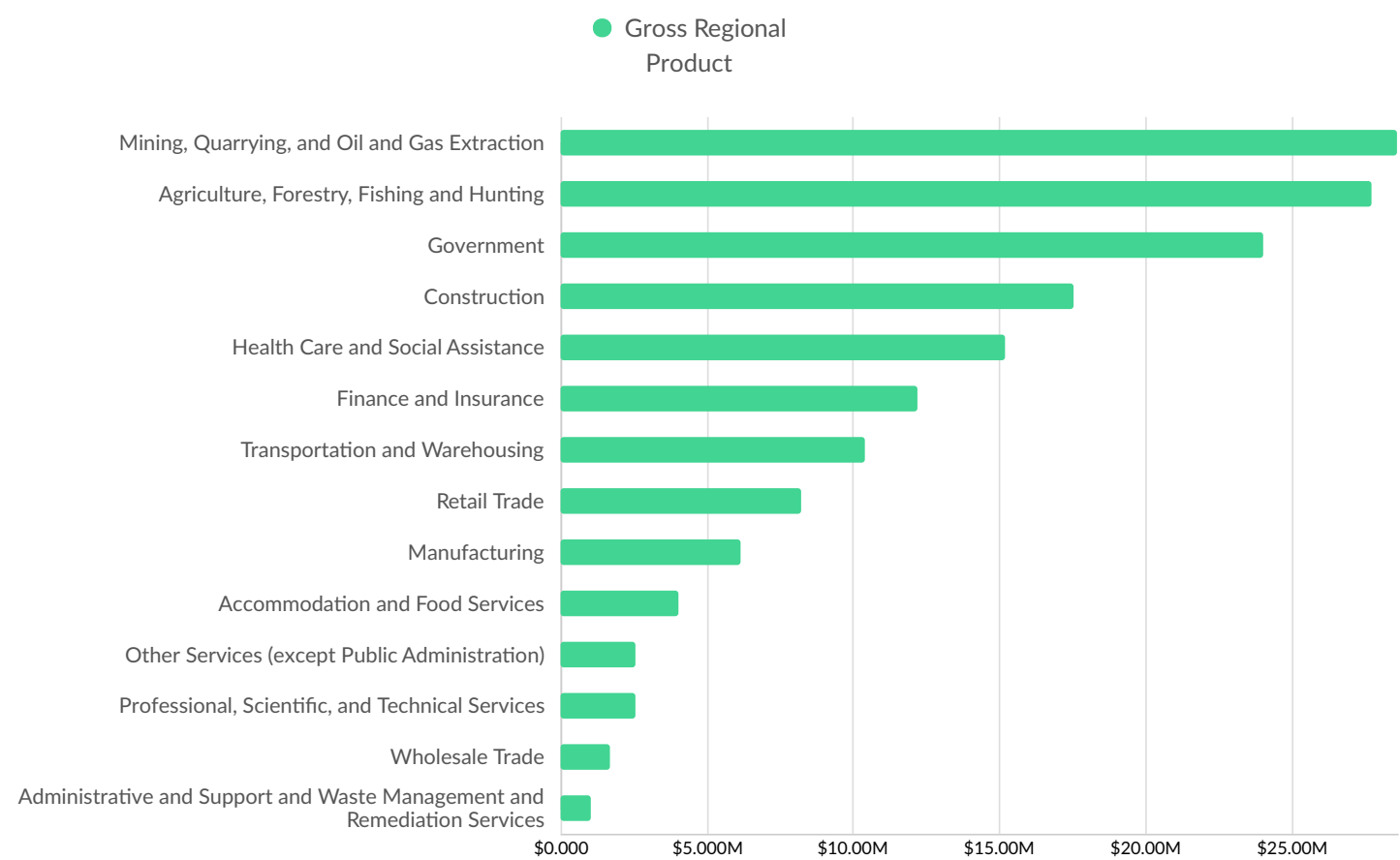
Top Growing Industries



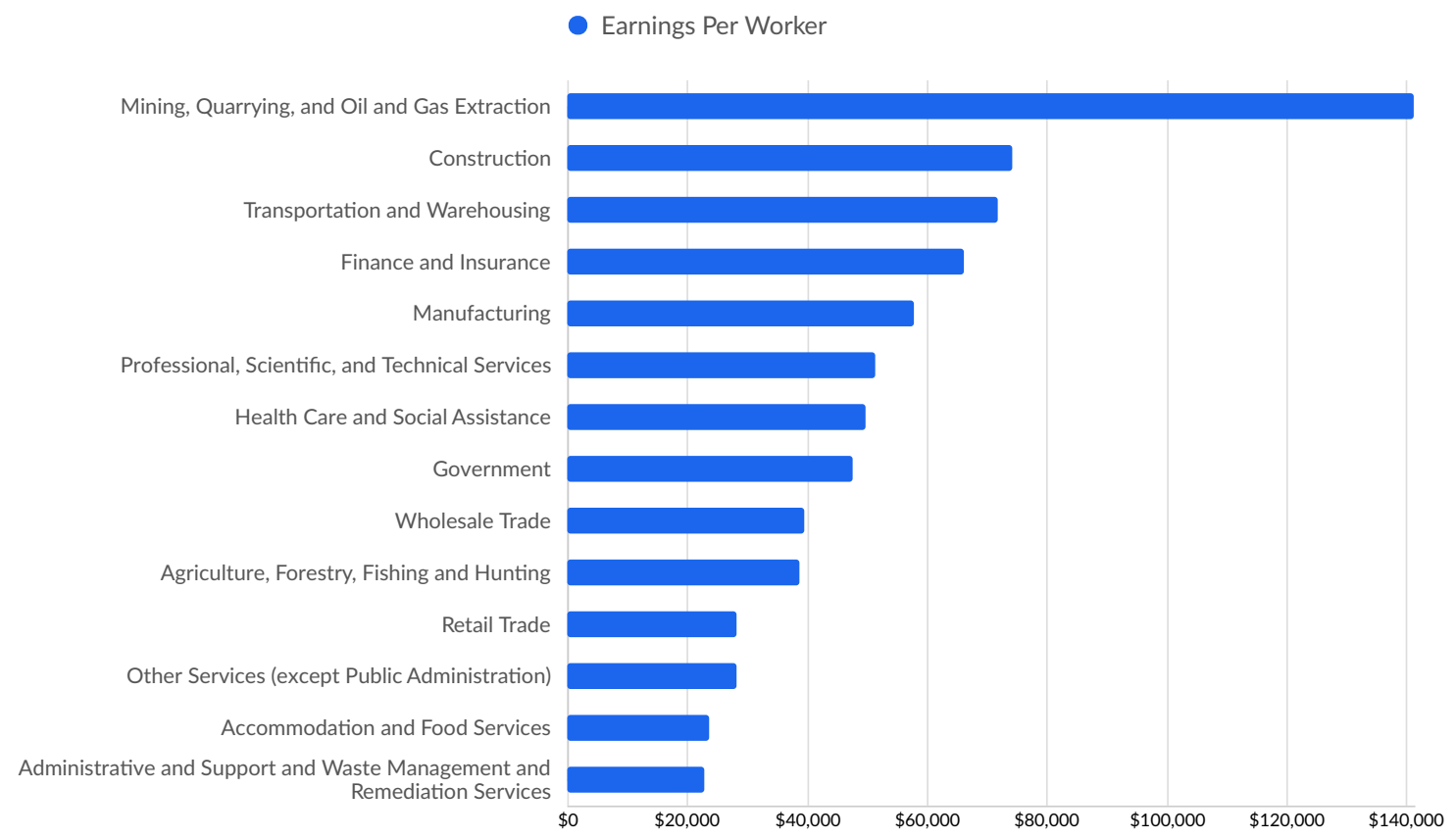
Top Industry Employment Concentration

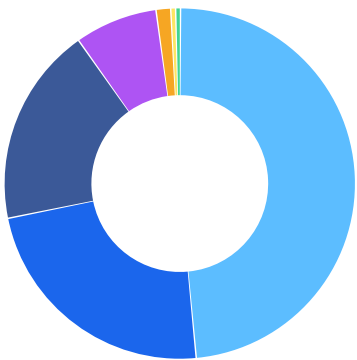

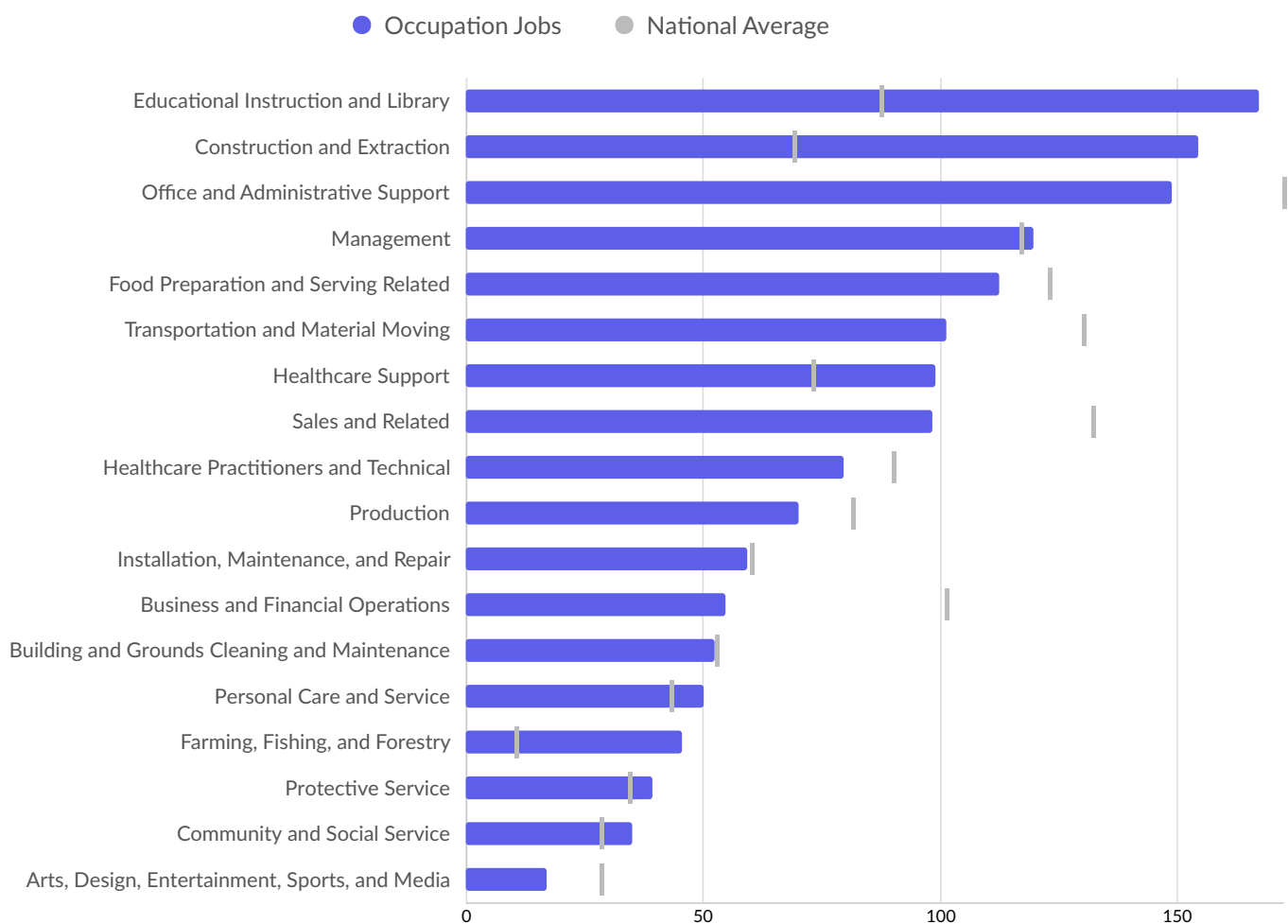

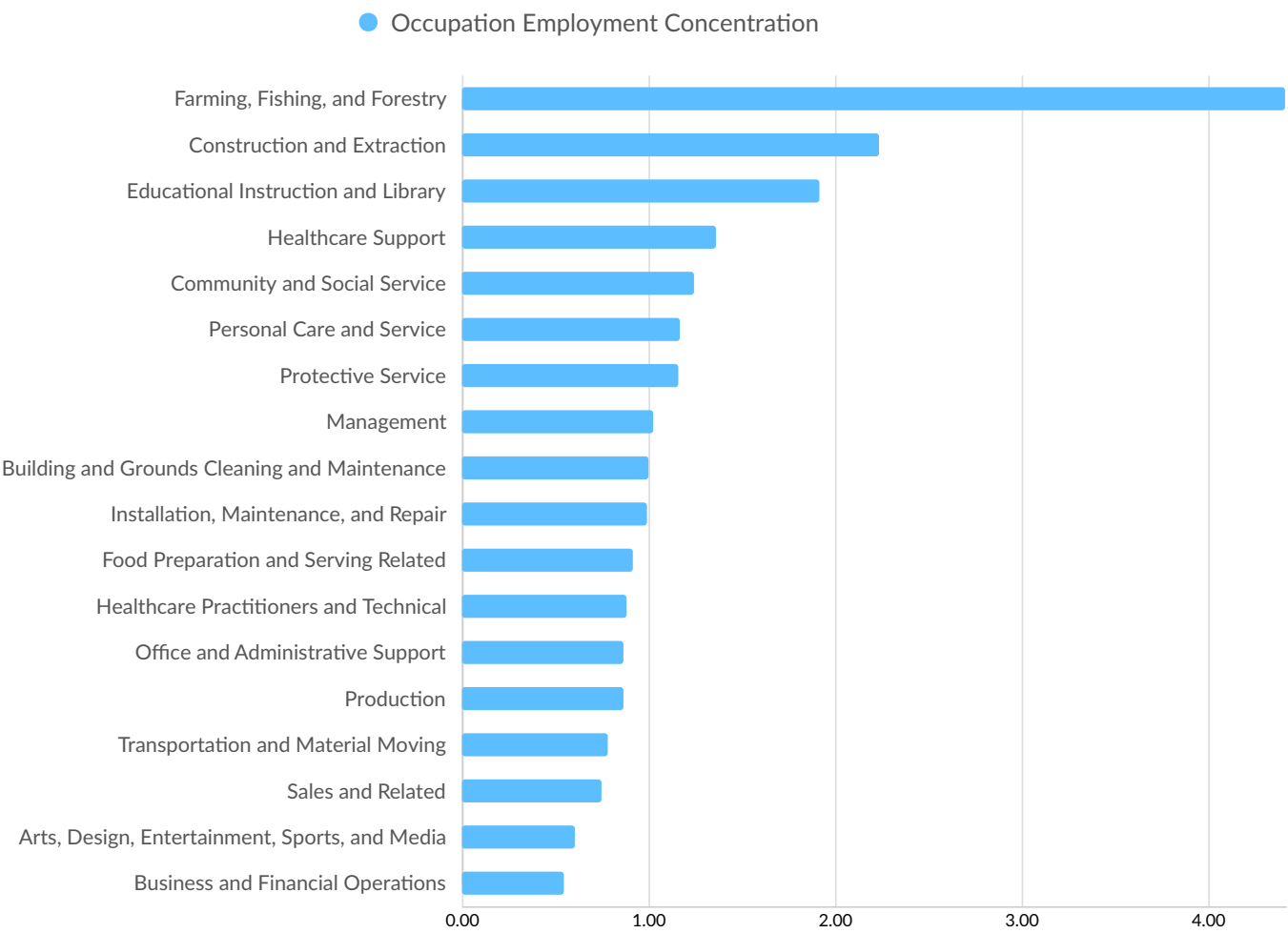

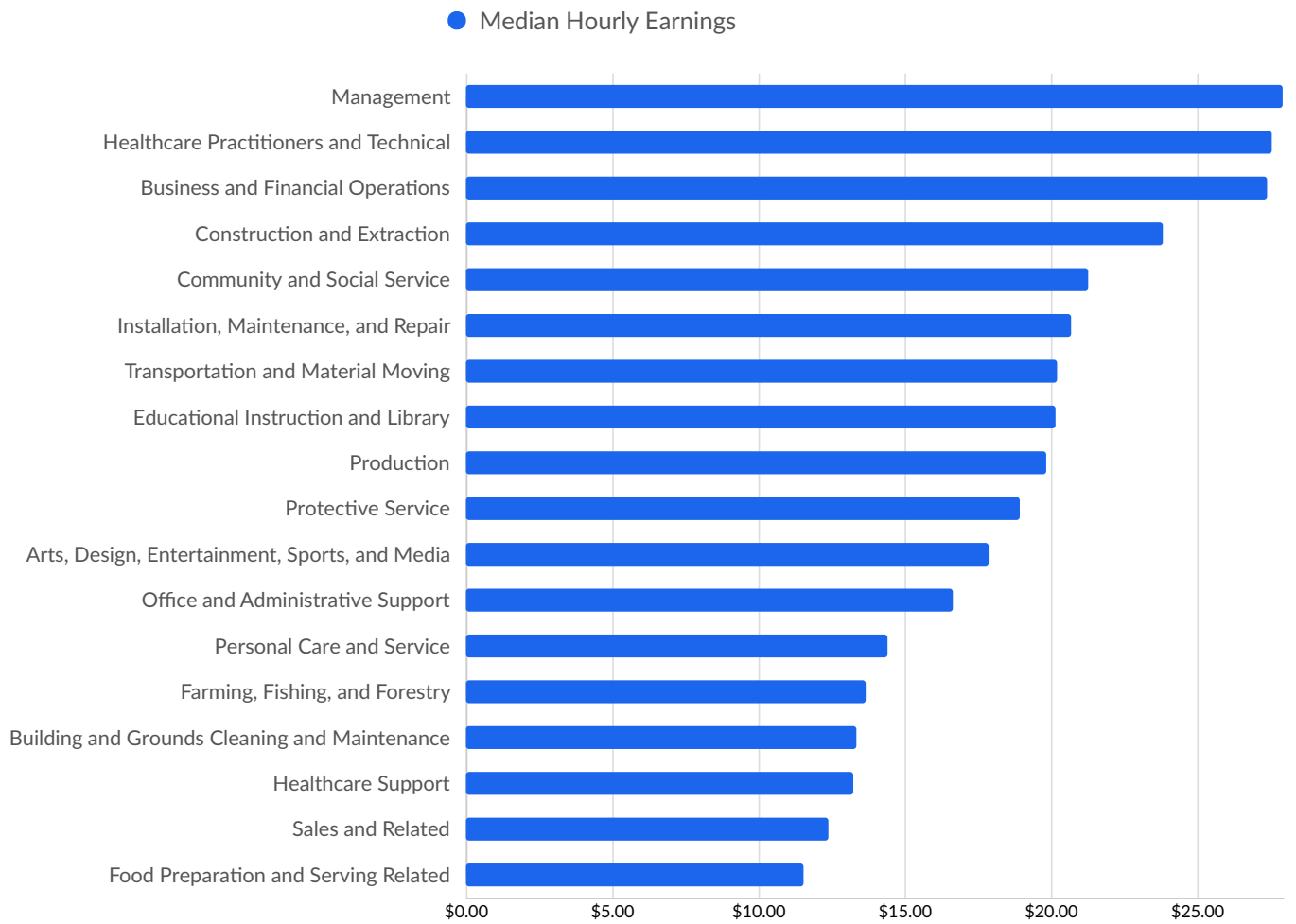
Top Growing Occupations



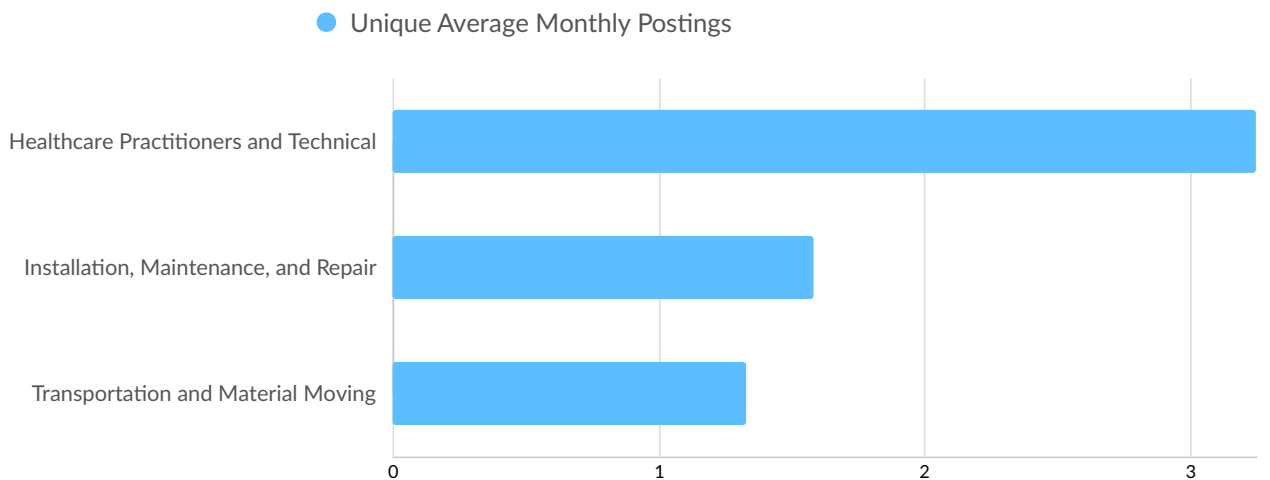
Top Occupation Employment Concentration



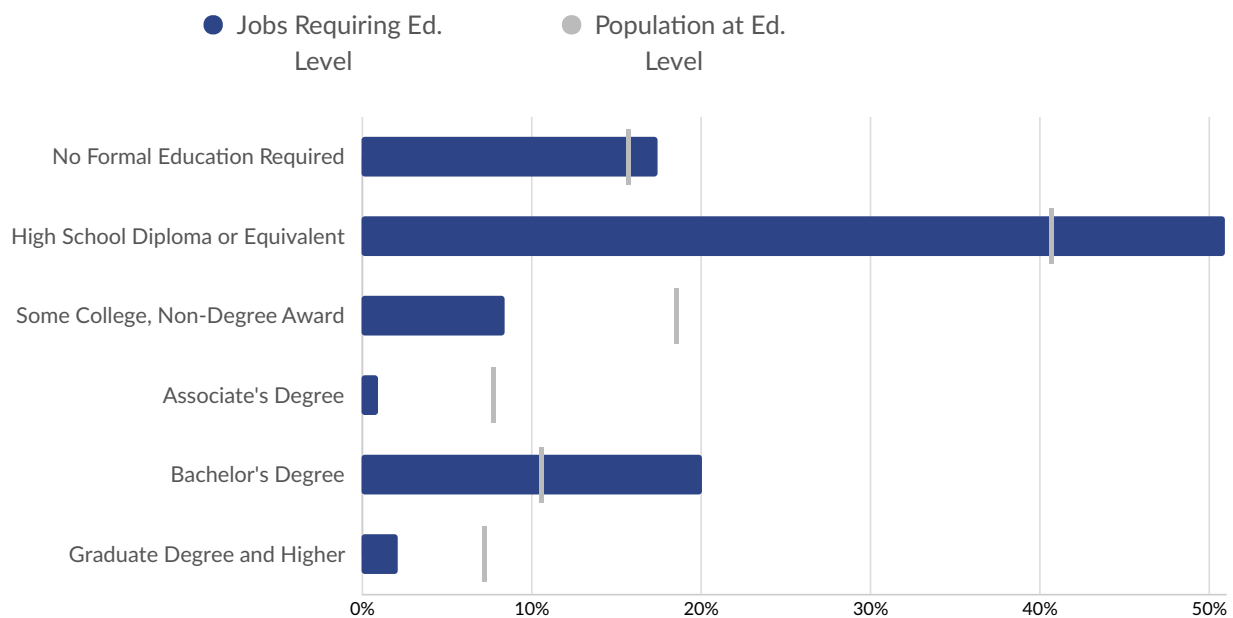
