


Median household income is \$23.8K below the national median household income of \$78.5K.

Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population **declined by 0.3%** since 2019, falling by 138. Population is expected to **increase by 0.5%** between 2024 and 2029, adding 225.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs **declined by 7.0%** in Pittsburg County, OK from 18,006 to **16,743**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 4.1% by 11.1%**. As the number of jobs declined, the **labor force participation rate decreased from 56.6% to 52.0% between 2019 and 2024**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **13.0% of Pittsburg County, OK residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (8.5% below the national average), and **9.4% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.6% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Federal Government, Civilian, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.


Apr 2025 Labor Force Breakdown

Educational Attainment





Unemployment by Age





Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity






Job Trends




Unemployment Rate Trends

Pittsburg County, OK had an April 2025 unemployment rate of 3.22%, decreasing from 7.36% 5 years before.








Racial Diversity

Pittsburg County, OK has 8,121 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 8,834.


Retirement risk is about average in Pittsburg County, OK. The national average for an area this size is 13,125 people 55 or older, while there are 14,359 here.

Racial diversity is low in Pittsburg County, OK. The national average for an area this size is 18,108 racially diverse people, while there are 14,022 here.




Veterans

Pittsburg County, OK has 2.18 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.54 per 1,000 people.




Property Crime








Top Growing Industries




Top Industry Employment Concentration







Top Occupation Employment Concentration




Top Occupation Earnings





Educational Pipeline

In 2023, there were 834 graduates in Pittsburg County, OK. This pipeline has shrunk by 29% over the last 5 years. The highest share of these graduates come from "Welding Technology/Welder" (Certificate), "Licensed Practical/Vocational Nurse Training" (Certificate), and "Nursing Assistant/Aide and Patient Care Assistant/Aide" (Certificate).
