


Median household income is **\$33.9K below** the national median household income of \$78.5K.

Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population **declined by 2.1%** since 2019, falling by 233. Population is expected to **increase by 0.1%** between 2024 and 2029, adding 13.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs **increased by 7.7%** in Pushmataha County, OK from 3,000 to **3,232**. This change **outpaced the national growth rate of 4.1% by 3.6%**. As the number of jobs increased, the **labor force participation rate increased from 47.9% to 52.5% between 2019 and 2024**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **7.7% of Pushmataha County, OK residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (13.8% below the national average), and **8.4% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.5% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Individual and Family Services.


Apr 2025 Labor Force Breakdown

Educational Attainment







Unemployment by Gender










Job Trends




Unemployment Rate Trends

Pushmataha County, OK had an April 2025 unemployment rate of 4.01%, decreasing from 6.98% 5 years before.








Racial Diversity


Pushmataha County, OK has 1,790 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 2,194.

Retirement risk is high in Pushmataha County, OK. The national average for an area this size is 3,260 people 55 or older, while there are 4,056 here.


Racial diversity is low in Pushmataha County, OK. The national average for an area this size is 4,498 racially diverse people, while there are 3,348 here.


Pushmataha County, OK has 724 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 534.








Top Growing Industries




Top Industry Employment Concentration







Top Occupation Employment Concentration




