ROADS

INFRASTRUCTURE

CITY OF ANTLERS

Funds were used to adjust the height of city manhole covers that will help with infiltration entering the sewer system ~ \$16,000

CITY OF ATOKA

Funds were used for a water/sewer project ~ \$28,200



ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

CITY OF ANTLERS

Funds were used to install a sidewalk along the school route ~ \$10,000

CITY OF BOSWELL

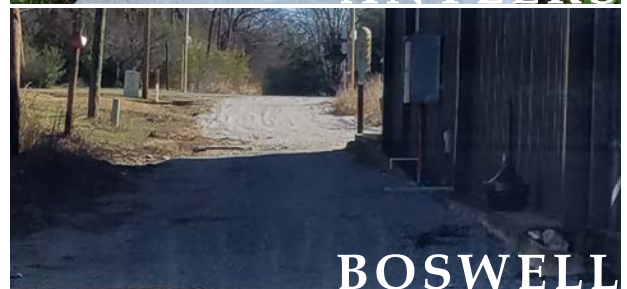
Funds were used to gravel the street behind the Choctaw Country Market, as well as gravel the school parking lot to make those areas safer for the community ~ \$14,100

CITY OF DURANT

Funds were used to make necessary improvements to University Boulevard and Radio Road ~ \$203,652

Funds were used to purchase gravel to make necessary street repairs that will make streets safer for the community and more appealing for those traveling through the area ~ \$11,500

Funds were used to add playground equipment at Connally Park ~ \$11,700

CITY OF CLAYTON

Funds were used to assist toward the purchase of a police vehicle ~ \$8,500

CITY OF GARVIN

Funds were used to continue basic municipal services ~ \$10,450

CITY OF HEAVENER

Funds were used to purchase wild land fire fighting equipment ~ \$6,750

PUSHMATAHA COUNTY

Funds were used to match federal funds to purchase new Sheriff's vehicles ~ \$15,000

Funds were used to purchase Christmas decorations for Main Street ~ \$7,500

CITY OF HUGO

Funds were used to demolish and clean-up some of the dilapidated buildings around town to make the community more appealing for residents and visitors ~ \$14,500

CITY OF MCALESTER

Funds were used to enhance the downtown street-scape project along Choctaw Avenue ~ \$11,800

Funds were used to purchase Christmas decorations for the City ~ \$11,300

EQUIPMENT

CITY OF CLAYTON

Funds were used to purchase a dump-truck for city use ~ \$10,000

CITY OF HEAVENER

Funds were used to match city funds to purchase a city vehicle ~ \$10,000

CITY OF STRINGTOWN

Funds were used to purchase a road grader and other equipment that will help maintain the city ~ \$24,200

MCCURTAIN COUNTY

Funds were used to purchase a line laser and traffic lane marker ~ \$24,400



DEFERRED MAINTENANCE

CITY OF HEAVENER

Funds were used for renovations to the newly purchased Police department ~ \$9,300

CITY OF HUGO

Funds were used to make necessary roof repairs to a city-owned building downtown ~ \$10,400

CHOCTAW COUNTY

Funds were used to make much needed roof repairs to the Workforce Development building ~ \$14,000

HASKELL COUNTY

Funds were used to update courthouse lighting and replace the 3rd floor courthouse windows ~ \$15,800

PUSHMATAHA COUNTY

Funds were used to replace the HVAC in the fair building as well as repairing the Courthouse boiler ~ \$58,900
